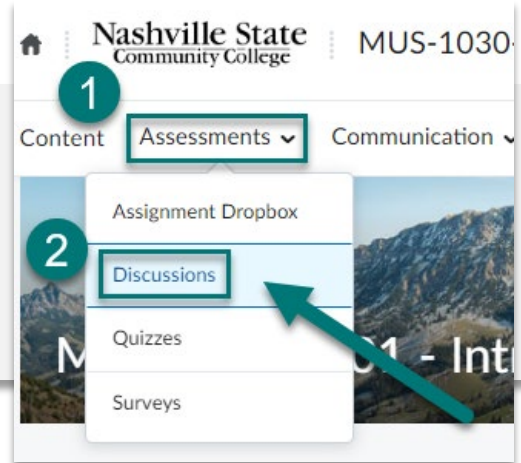


Posting to a Discussion

Go to Discussions

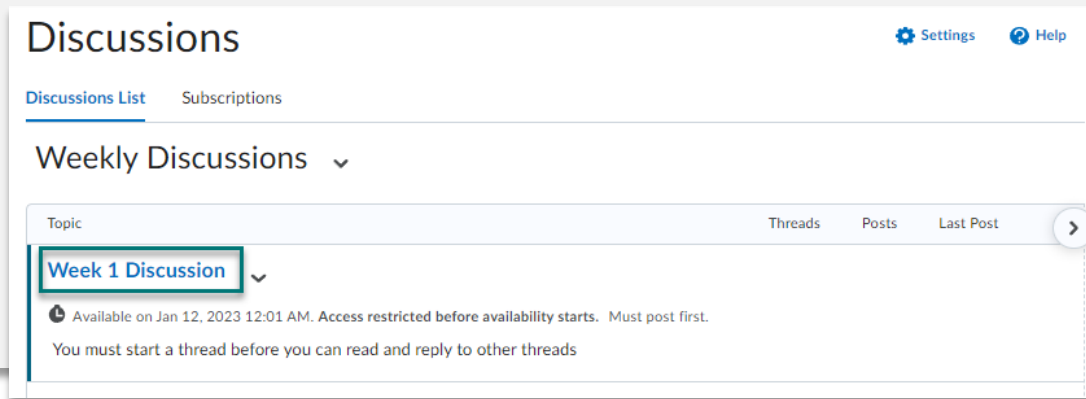
The **Discussions** area is where you will participate in online discussions with your instructor and classmates.

Open the Discussion Topic

From the **Discussions** list, select the topic to which you wish to post.

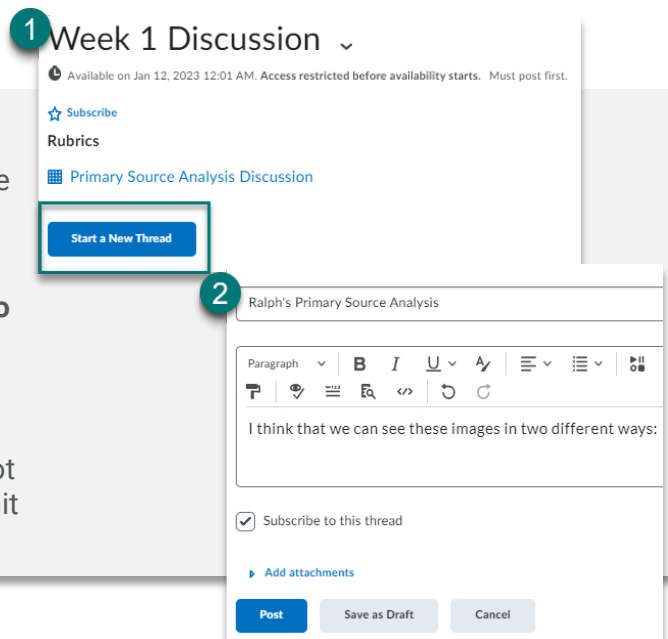


Write Your Post


Click **Start a New Thread** at the top. A text editor will open, allowing you to type your post.

You also have the option to **Subscribe to this thread** so that you can get notifications of replies to your post.

Click **Post** when you're done. You will not be able to edit your post once you submit it.


To **subscribe** to any discussion topic, click the blue star under the topic's title.


